# IWA SUPPORTS WATERWAY FREIGHT CARRIAGE

The Inland Waterways Association today reaffirmed its full support for possible expansions in waterway freight carriage by calling on all users of the inland waterways to recognise the benefits of such usage.

The Association has made it clear that it believes commercial carrying should be an integral part of future waterway usage. IWA is concerned that 'not in my back yard' objections to proposed schemes aimed at bringing back working boats on some waterways may jeopardise a valuable opportunity to revive water based transport. With the Government appearing to be keen on embracing 'new' modes of transport in order to reduce pressure on Britain's gridlocked road network, IWA believes that there is an opportunity to revive the fortunes of the waterways by diversifying their usage. The Association hopes that schemes will receive support from a wide range of users.

IWA National Chairman, Mr Richard Drake, today said "It is important that existing users of the waterways not only accept, but champion commercial carrying on a wider scale. Commercial carrying by boats is, after all, the reason why canals are here in the first place and this should not be forgotten. Furthermore, water based transport is far more fuel efficient than either road or rail transport and, therefore, has certain environmental benefits, which should be appreciated."

Mr Drake continued "There have been concerns expressed that commercial barges may pose a hazard to other users, particularly those of small boats, and also

where children are involved. Whilst we recognise these concerns, they appear to be ill founded. Increases in commercial carrying will not turn the waterways into the equivalent of motorways, nose to tail with large commercial barges. Recreational craft would still constitute by far the biggest proportion of traffic and people would probably notice very little change. In any event, pilots of commercial craft are well trained, experienced and capable and should pose no threat to other users. This really is an opportunity which must be grasped with both hands, as we do not know how long the political climate will be so favourable for commercial waterway use."

The Government's White Paper on Integrated Transport, issued in July 1998 recommends that appropriate freight transport be moved from road to waterway. At a recent meeting with inland waterway user representatives, the waterways minister, Mr Alan Meale, M.P., said that the Government were committed to moving 3% of all road freight to the waterways. IWA applauds this commitment. Whilst the majority of such waterway freight will be by coastal shipping and large vessels appropriate to estuaries and wide waterways, IWA believes there remain appropriate niche markets for traditional barges, narrowboats and other craft of modest dimension. Such freight movement by canals and river navigations is not only environmentally friendly, but adds colour and vitality to the inland waterways.

## JOHN GOULD MBE

John Gould toiled for half a century to see the gloriously sunny day in August 1990 when the Queen reopened the Kennet and Avon Canal.

He acquired a pair of narrow boats with the intention of trading on the canal soon after the last war; however by 1951 the waterway had become unnavigable. Working with a former colleague, John Knill, who died last year, Gould began a ferocious fight. Their persistence produced a petition of 22,000 signatures and helped

Abandonment from reaching Parliament in 1955.

In the meantime, Gould had fought and won a lengthy court case with the Docks and Inland Waterways Executive over the loss of revenue from his narrow boats. With the ensuing compensation, he acquired a series of pleasure craft and houseboats. These provided the income he needed while fighting his sometimes lonely campaign for funding restoration.

Once restoration started, he strived
