HS2 at Fradley Junction

Under HS2's proposals, a permanent access road would have been built adjacent to the Trent & Mersey Canal at Pyford Brook, in the popular Fradley Junction area.

Following extensive negotiations, HS2 has agreed to introduce an 'Additional Provision' to address our concerns. HS2's access road will be rerouted to radically reduce the visual and aural impact on boaters and canal visitors in the area.

We have also reached agreement with HS2 on minimising the impact of construction works in the area. This includes reducing the impact of works on the canal towpath and minimising canal closures, especially during peak seasons, to facilitate works.

Peter Walker, head of technical support at the Canal & River Trust, said: "The Fradley Junction area, where the Coventry Canal joins the Trent & Mersey Canal, is one of the busiest and most vibrant places on the waterways.

Canal Closures

Due to the continued drawdown of the reservoirs, the prolonged low rainfall and with the forecast for further dry weather, CRT will be implementing temporary closures to navigation on a number of waterways mainly in the north of England.

It's not clear how long the closures or restrictions will last for but it's likely to be throughout August and potentially beyond if there is no significant, sustained rainfall. While the closures will prevent use of these stretches of canal by boats the towpath will remain open for visitors and the local community alike to enjoy.

The following list of these closures (both current and proposed) has been trawled from the CRT website on 26 July. Updated information on these and other restrictions to navigation can be found at <https://canalrivertrust.org.uk/notices/>

Leeds & Liverpool Canal

From below lock 85 on the Wigan Flight to below lock 30 at Gargrave commencing on Monday 30 July.

The lock flights at Wigan (locks 65 to 85), Barrowford Locks (45 to 51), Greenberfield Locks (42 to 44), Bank Newton Locks (36 to 41) and Gargrave (Holme Bridge Lock 30) will be padlocked closed and the gates will be ashed up to reduce leakage. To prevent unauthorised access though vandalism,

measures will be taken to make the locks inoperable.

Bingley Five Rise and Bingley Three Rise Locks will be restricted to passage at the following times; passage down in the morning (between 8am and 12pm) and passage up in the afternoon (between 1pm and 5pm). The lock flights will be padlocked closed at 5pm. Please ensure that you enter the lock flight with sufficient time to get through, noting the last passage commencement times above. Moorings are available at the top and bottom of the flights.

The Leeds & Liverpool Canal is currently closed to navigation between Bridge 10 (Holmes Swing Bridge) to Stanley Top Lock / Eldonian Village in Liverpool due to a collapsed culvert (No. 29) in Melling. Works continue on site and the team are now in the process of installing the new culvert. An update will be issued on Friday 27 July 2018.

Huddersfield Narrow Canal

CRT will be closing navigation between locks 24 West to 1 East (from above Uppermill across to Huddersfield), commencing on Monday 6 August. The locks will be padlocked closed and the gates will be ashed up to reduce leakage. To prevent use, measures will be taken to make the locks inoperable.

CRT Annual Report & Accounts 2017/18 published

Our 2017/18 Annual Report & Accounts chart a further year of progress. In particular it has been a record year for volunteering with active volunteers now significantly exceeding the number of employees as they help deliver our charitable objectives as a Trust for the waterways and wellbeing.

In addition to volunteers clocking-up more than 600,000 hours, with a remarkable 96% satisfaction rate, the overall condition of our waterways continued to improve year-on-year with core spending on waterway infrastructure, maintenance and repairs rising to almost £132m.

Richard Parry, chief executive, comments: "We have seen another strong year as the Trust works towards its vision of transforming places and enriching lives. Our continued growth in volunteering complements and enhances the vital work that our experienced and skilled colleagues deliver.

"Our work across the network has been underpinned by an increase in the number of boats together with strong investment and income performance which now sees the Trust generate more than £150m each year in addition to our £50m government grant. This means we can continue the underlying increase in spend on the care and repair of our waterways."

Highlights in the 2017/18 Annual Report & Accounts include:

- Volunteering exceeding 600,000 hours, with 96% satisfaction amongst our volunteers
- 225 community adoptions, empowering local people to get involved

- An improvement in the overall condition of the waterways and a rise to £131.6m in core spending on waterway infrastructure, maintenance and repairs
- Strong investment performance which, together with our sources of income, generated over £200m
- A rise in boat numbers to over 34,000 with the lowest ever licence evasion
- A 15% growth in Friends to 24,000 with donations up to £6.1m, including from players of the People's Postcode Lottery
- A further reduction in unplanned closures to navigation
- An improvement in towpath user satisfaction with 372m visits to our waterways and visitors to our museums up 39% to 48,000
- Engagement with 80,000 children through our Explorers education programme
- Green Flag status awarded to 160 miles of waterways
- Publication of our Outcomes Measurement Framework to capture and quantify the benefits that waterways and our work make to society
- A relaunch of our brand position to reach new audiences and better reflect the ambition to be a charity for the waterways and wellbeing

Rochdale Canal

CRT will be closing sections of the Rochdale Canal between locks 1 and 48 (from Sowerby Bridge to Littleborough), commencing on Monday 6 August. A short stretch of the navigation between locks 6 and 19 (east of Mytholmroyd to Todmorden) is an exception and will be restricted to the period between 10am and 2pm under a local booking system. A further notice issued today states that full closure between locks 7 and 11 has been imposed.

The locks, 19 to 48, will be padlocked closed and the gates will be ashed up to reduce leakage. To prevent use, measures will be taken to make the locks inoperable.

Peak Forest Canal

Due to further movement of the chamber wall at Marple Lock 11, the lock is now too narrow for boats to fit through safely. As such, the Marple Lock Flight is closed to navigation.

CRT considered repeating the jacking operation to the lock walls to try and get a couple of additional weeks of navigation. However, they have dismissed this option as this would likely take around 2 weeks to complete and would coincide with the date they have decided to close the Marple and Bosley Flights to preserve water on the Upper Peak Forest and Macclesfield Canals.

CRT are busy planning to complete the re-building of the lock walls and the Flight will remain closed until this is complete. They will be able to provide an update on the proposed timescales as soon as they are available.

June Meeting

Royal National Lifeboat Institution - Caroline Tilley

The Royal National Lifeboat Institution representative Caroline Tilley and her team produced a very informative and interesting evening.

The RNLI was formed on the 4th March 1824 by William M Hillary. It is now reckoned to be the best in the world able to help with flood and sea rescues. Our local stations are on the River Hamble, Fawley, Cowes, Yarmouth, Lyminster and Christchurch. All UK waters and the Republic of Ireland are included.

The range and type of boat required in this day are amazing from the all-weather, self-righting one hundred mile range craft controlled by a very experienced crew. Hover craft and smaller boats used for in shore rescues. Tower Bridge & Waterloo Bridge in London are stationed with

CRT is closing off access to Bugsworth Basin, on Monday 13 August.

Bosley Locks, Macclesfield Canal

The Bosley Flight (locks 1 to 12) are restricted to the period between 8am and 2pm. Whilst this will conserve water in the short term, CRT expect to temporarily close the canal at Bosley on Monday 13 August. The rest of the Macclesfield Canal (below Bosley) will remain unrestricted.

Glasson Locks, Lancaster Canal

Following a sustained period of warm weather, there are unexpected levels of weed growth on the feed at Tewitfield on the Lancaster Canal. This has resulted in low water levels. To conserve as much water as possible, the Glasson Flight has been closed to navigation.

Weaver Navigation

Serious damage has been caused to the lock gates at Marsh Lock due to a large vessel running into them. The repairs will be a long process and the lock is now closed until further notice. There will be no passage between the Manchester Ship Canal and Weaver Navigation until further notice.

There are also restrictions on the use of Saltersford, Dutton, Hunts and Vale Royal Locks.

Middlewich Branch, Shropshire Union Canal

Since the breach on 15th March, work has been progressing to provide access the breach area. Repairs to rebuild the embankment itself will then follow. The design for the embankment repair is complex but this is progressing and nearing completion.

The canal is expected to be re-opened at Christmas; further information will be available as the extent of the repair work is confirmed and timescales become clearer.
