**Inland Boating Returns to London Boat Show**

The best of the country's inland boating opportunities will be showcased at the 2018 London Boat Show from 10<sup>th</sup> - 14<sup>th</sup> January at London's ExCel. We have been looking forward to the return of an inland waterways feature to the show and our wish has been granted with exhibits from hireboat and holiday operators.

The highlight of the feature is a water-filled lock which can be admired with a drink in hand from the garden of the Lock Keeper's Inn. Two boats will be moored by the lock, a 38ft cruiser and the 35ft

historic tug, Sandbach. Belonging to an IWA team member, Sandbach is a steel tug originally built in 1946 for the London Midland and Scottish Railway for towing on the Shropshire Union Canal, and later on the River Weaver.

Both rivers and canals will be represented at the show plus IWA will be there to answer questions covering the breadth of the nation's 6,500 miles of waterways as well as discuss the Association's campaign plans for the coming year.

**IWA calls for MPs' support for EA waterways transfer**

The IWA has given its backing to CRT's formal submission to Defra for the transfer of the Environment Agency's navigation responsibilities.

IWA national chairman, Ivor Caplin, has written to Waterway Minister, Dr Thérèse Coffey MP, to assure her of IWA's support for the proposal.

He said transfer of these navigations to CRT would allow these waterways to benefit from improved maintenance, third party funding opportunities and

the economies to be gained from being part of a larger navigation authority.

IWA has also written to about 100 MPs to ask them to write to the Minister with their support, including those with EA navigations in their constituencies, members of the All Party Parliamentary Group for the Waterways, and other MPs who have previously indicated their support for the transfer.

## IWA Welcomes New Initiative to Combat Licence Fraud

IWA supports Canal & River Trust's new mooring validation scheme which should help combat licence fraud.

Canal & River Trust has announced that it will be working with mooring operators to confirm that the records they hold for where boats are moored is correct. This will ensure the Trust is monitoring boats against the correct terms and conditions, and will give mooring operators the confidence that their sites aren't being used fraudulently.

The roll-out follows a pilot involving twelve mooring operators, with the help of the Association of Waterway Cruising Clubs and British Marine. Following a routine check of the site, the Trust provided the operators with two lists of information to check, comprising boats recorded as

having a mooring at the site but not seen, and boats seen moored at the site but not being recorded as having a mooring there. The operators reviewed the lists, following which the boats' records were updated and, where necessary, boaters were contacted to get an update on the home mooring status for their boats.

The Trust will now ask mooring operators if they would like to sign up to the scheme, which at this stage will run on an opt-in basis. Mooring operators that wish to be involved should contact the Trust via customer services on 030 3040 4040 or the 'contact us' page of the charity's website.

## IWA concerned over reservoir water supply

THE Inland Waterways Association has raised concerns with Canal & River Trust after being advised that water from Chasewater Reservoir, which is a major water supply to the BCN, was terminated by the owners, Staffordshire County Council, earlier in the year and that no water has been available to Canal & River Trust's canal network from the reservoir since the Spring.

A valve which controls the water feed into the Anglesey Branch was declared unsafe in April 2017, cutting off the main water supply to the BCN. For historical reasons, the reservoir is owned by Staffordshire County Council and managed as part of the Chasewater Country Park, although Canal & River Trust has rights to the water.

It has come to light that the valve that should be used to control the water has been inoperable for a number of years

and the one that is now closed is intended to be used only for the emergency drawdown of the water from Chasewater.

Staffordshire County Council is in continued discussion with Canal & River Trust to develop a temporary alternative form of water extraction from Chasewater into the canal network that provides both a solution for the canal system but also allows the reservoir to operate at a level that does not impinge on the Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI).

Meanwhile, Canal & River Trust has virtually emptied Rotten Park reservoir, which was already low after a dry winter, as well as increasing pumping from the Bradley borehole and using back pumping at Titford, in order to maintain water levels.

## Rochdale Canal community garden project

A community 'linear larder' garden along the banks of the Rochdale Canal comes under the spotlight in a new BBC One daytime TV series, 'Let's Get a Good Thing Going'.

Incredible Edible Todmorden is one of half a dozen community groups bidding for funds in an episode based around Hebden Bridge, West Yorkshire, which will be broadcast on Friday 22 December at 9.15am. [Although the programme has been broadcast already, it is available on BBC iPlayer until 10.00am on 21 January 2018 - Ed]

Jon Stopp, CRT's volunteer waterway partner leads the quest for more funds to install public benches, bird boxes and fruit trees along the canal towpath.

The waterside gardens grew out of our wider community canal connections project in the Calder Valley, launched in 2012. Dozens of small patches of public land have now been cultivated as plots for growing herbs, fruit and vegetables, which people can then harvest for free.

Now a much-loved feature of Todmorden town centre, Incredible Edible's garden plots are sited in a variety of locations and lovingly maintained by an enthusiastic band of volunteers, led by Mary Clear.

Jon said: "Incredible Edible is a fantastic community project which has now been replicated by other towns in the UK and abroad. We know people feel healthier and happier when they're by waterways and enjoying nature, particularly in urban areas.

"We wanted to use the opportunity presented by the TV programme to raise money to install more fruit trees, benches and bird boxes. The idea is to encourage residents and visitors to come down to the canal, sit, watch and engage with other people and enjoy the lovely waterway environment."

Viewers can find out whether Jon was successful in his quest by tuning into Let's Get a Good Thing Going programme on Friday.
