WATERWAYS HONOUR

Members of the Southampton Canal Society, and many others interested in the waterways, will be pleased by the honour of an OBE accorded to recently retired National Chairman of the Association, Mrs Audrey Smith. The announcement of the appointment was made as part of the annual Queen's Birthday Honours List.

Audrey Smith was National Chairman of the IWA from 1994 to 1998, following a term as Chairman of IWA's North West Region. She has also served in a variety of other roles within the Association since joining nearly 30 years ago.

Current IWA National Chairman, Mr Richard Drake, said, "It is an honour well deserved. Audrey Smith has served this Association with skill and determination. Her period of Chairmanship saw an increase of the Association's influence and standing and I am sure it will be looked back upon as part of a Golden Era for the IWA."

Richard Drake added, "I would like to think that the honour reflects well, not only on the fine work that Audrey

has undertaken for the Association over the years, but also on her many continuing endeavours for the waterways and all for which the Association stands. Indeed, although Audrey stood down as IWA's National Chairman, she continues to serve the inland waterways. She is active within the IWA in her home Region and represents the IWA on a number of canal restoration Trusts, and she is a member of the Inland Waterways Amenity Advisory Council."

He went on, "The IWA has been served by many eminent figures over the years, whose worthiness for honour was recognised within the waterway movement. It is perhaps a reflection of the greater esteem in which canal and river navigations are now held by Government, that Audrey's contribution is recognised more widely. Her hard work and skilful lobbying in all the right places contributed in no small measure to the change of attitude and we are absolutely delighted at the honour which she is now receiving."

ROMSEY WALK

A reminder that an informal walk is to be held on Sunday 11th July and will take in the stretch of the Andover Canal (usually known as the Romsey Canal) which runs for about 1½ miles on the north side of Romsey.

We will start the morning by having a look over the preserved Romsey Signal Box which was rescued by enthusiasts when it became redundant a number of years ago. It has been fully restored to working condition on a site only a few yards from its original position and also next to the canal.

Once we've finished there, we'll walk north along the former towpath towards Timsbury. Near the north end of this stretch of canal, lies the Duke's Head public house. By the time we get there, it should be open for those who would like a drink and / or a snack. Walkers will be free to make their way back to the start point in their own time.

We will be meeting outside the Plaza Theatre in Winchester Road, Romsey (NG Reference SU358213) at 10.30am. Car parking is available nearby. Hope to see lots of you there!!

Waste by Water

Waterways Minister Alan Meale attended the launch of a waterborne freight scheme on the River Lee Navigation on 13th May and took a trip on a specially converted commercial barge, destined to transport container packed waste to an 'Energy from Waste' plant at Edmonton.

'Waste by Water' is a partnership of local authorities, private waste management companies, BW and the Environment Agency and has now concluded satisfactory viability trials of the scheme, which could eventually remove over 45,000 dustcart loads per annum from North London's roads, by carrying the waste in 72 tonne loads by water. The 'Waste by Water' partnership will now produce a full feasibility study report based on the successful trials whilst an application for a Freight Facility Grant is to be submitted shortly.

Unfortunately for the Minister, his trip on the new open top boat coincided with a rain storm, which left him with only an umbrella for protection, whilst lesser dignitaries travelling in an older boat behind benefited from the protection of a small cabin!

RIVER NENE

At the end of May, three narrow boat loads of timber were taken by South Midland Water Transport from Wisbech to Northampton as a trial run for possible longer term commercial carrying contracts on the River Nene.

The timber, destined for Travis Perkins Ltd who have supported the trial, would normally have arrived at Kings Lynn Docks and been taken to Northampton by road, but was instead diverted to the Port of Wisbech where Fenland District Council have a firm commitment to encourage waterborne transport and the revival of the Port.
