May Meeting Paul Gosling - "Gosling's Gallivants 2009"

Although nominally the May meeting, we gathered on the last Thursday in April as the hall would be unavailable owing to the following week's election.

The width of Paul's interests in transport was amply demonstrated by the slides he showed - including views of trains, buses, other historic on-and-off-road vehicles, boats and even planes. This short report can give no more than a brief glimpse of this presentation.

Paul's Gallivants around the country are made using rail and bus. For example, he made a 6am departure on an ex Post Office train to Llandudno for the Transport Festival and Victorian Extravaganza. This features a carnival, a fair and displays of vintage cars and buses. These included a 1963 "Southern Vectis" coach, "Bubble Cars" and an 80-year old Southampton University charabanc with trans-verse seats and no brakes - stopping was achieved by using

the gears!

Nearer to home, Paul showed views of Southampton Docks taken from the railway bridge overlooking the old dry dock at Millbrook. This is an excellent spot for viewing goods trains, fire tenders and electro-diesels.

The local interest was maintained with slides of the old British Rail ferries that plied to the Isle of Wight. These were followed by the Red Jet Hi-Speed catamarans that run between Southampton and West Cowes and the new Lymington to Yarmouth Wightlink ferry.

Pictures of the impressive B17 Bomber, the Vulcan and Euro fighter finished off the interesting evening. Thus we were presented not only with Yesterday's History but also Today's and Tomorrow's History.

Historic lock preserved

The remains of Mansbridge Lock in Southampton have been preserved by the Itchen Navigation Heritage Trail Project, coinciding with the 300th anniversary of the opening of the Itchen Navigation as a trading route.

Mansbridge Lock has national significance as is it is one of only a handful of examples of 'turf-sided' locks left in the country. Turf-sided describes the fact that the lock only had brickwork at each end were the lock gates hung and in between the walls of the lock chamber were built up with material such as chalk.

Last year, volunteers worked to clear back vegetation which had grown over and through the lock brickwork obscuring it from view. When the lock was revealed it was clear that parts of the lock were in danger of crumbling away altogether due to tree root damage. Professional bricklayers were called in to anchor the lock remains to the bank and repair the brickwork.
