Chairman's Column

The quiz had all the usual challenges and a number of the questions were a little difficult for some of us. As usual, the large audience was also able to take

part.

The result of the 2002 Quiz was a very close run event, with the Southampton Canal Society, consisting of Laura Sturrock, Peter Oates, Eric Lewis and myself, finally winning by a margin of just ½ point from the IWA Solent & Arun Branch, thereby reversing their positions of last year, followed by the Salisbury Group. The trophy (the base of which had had to have an additional tier added to its base, by Eric Lewis, to accommodate additional winners plaques) was presented to Southampton's Peter Oates.

There then followed the traditional American Supper which was enjoyed by all.

February Meeting - Dennis Bright - Wildlife on the Itchen (etc)

Every so often we try and introduce a different kind of topic into our monthly programme. We certainly came up trumps with Dennis Bright, a renowned local photographer, who provided us with a fantastic series of scenes, illustrated by slides, at our January meeting.

Whilst loosely based on a theme of Wildlife on the Itchen, Dennis covered such a wide range of issues which encompassed the Itchen Valley, both the former navigation and the river itself. We saw the waterways in a number of their moods, particularly during the time of heavy flooding due to the excessive rainfall and ground saturation a few months ago.

The waters had turned neighbouring fields and pastures into a completely different landscape which, at the same time, provided a new habitat for various

types of wildlife. We saw splendid shots of the wildlife that abounds in the Itchen Valley.

A near capacity audience, including several guests, appeared spellbound with the subject and quality of Dennis's photographs. For those members who missed this presentation, don't worry. Dennis has a number of different programmes he is able to offer and I am sure that we will see a return visit by Dennis next year.

Following on from the January meeting, members were again able to participate in Peter Glover's canal postcard competition. I am afraid that I am unable to tell you who was the winner - because nobody told me! Watch this space.

The Society is grateful for the generosity of members in donating the following two books to the Society Library:-

The Water Road by Paul Gogarty. This book (published 2002), described as "A Narrowboat Odyssey Through England", is a story of a magical journey through backdoor England. To escape the 'hurry-sickness' of modern life, Paul Gogarty – acclaimed travel writer and TV presenter – disappears for four months into a maze of canals linking the Thames with the Severn, Mersey and Trent. Here he discovers a world no less enchanted than Alice's, a secret network as powerful as ley lines. *The Water Road* is both a celebration of a secret England and a powerful personal odyssey, in which the author marks his own rite of passage.

The Somersetshire Coal Canal Rediscovered by Niall Allsop. This is a revised edition (published 1993) of this popular walker's guide. For anybody wishing to stumble on and explore a lost world while enjoying some of this country's richest scenery, this book will prove an ideal companion.

Small Boat Through Holland by Roger Pilkington (published 1962). One of the classic series of "Small Boat" books from a period when there was little waterways information available in print.

Waterways on TV

For the last few weeks the Waterworld programme has been broadcast in the ITV Central region at 7.30pm on a Thursday evening. Unfortunately for many of us, Meridian does not broadcast Waterworld preferring to show a local programme at this time.

However, if you have Sky Digital it is possible to view Waterworld but you will need to set it up first in the following manner:

Press the Services button and then choose option 4 for System Setup and then 4 again for Add Channels. Type in the frequency 10832 and change the polarity letter to H. The Symbol Rate should be changed to 22.0 and FEC set to 5/6. Choose Find Channels and, if you typed in the correct settings above, a list of ITV channels should appear including ITV Central. Highlight the name and press the yellow button to add the channel to your list. Press the Select button to save your choice. ITV Central will now be available under the Other Channels option on the Services menu.

I don't know but if you have another system such as cable it may be to receive ITV Central.
