#### **Cotswold Canals Funding**

COTSWOLD Canals Trust and Stroud District Council have welcomed the news that the Canal & River Trust is backing the bid to reconnect Stroud to the national canal network.

Canal & River Trust trustees have pledged £625,000 to support the restoration of the Cotswold Canal. The assistance will be spread over five years from 2018 if a bid this year to the Heritage Lottery Fund is successful. This is in addition to the support 'in kind' that the Trust can also provide.

David Hagg, chief executive of Stroud District Council, comments: "The funds could be an important factor in helping to secure a bid by **Cotswold Canals Trust and Stroud** District Council to the Heritage Lottery Fund later this year which would see nearly £20m overall investment in the waterway.

"If the bid is successful, it will fulfil the waterway movement's long held ambition to connect approximately 11 miles of 'new' canal to the wider network as it will connect the six miles of largely restored canal around Stroud, to the Canal & River Trust's network at Saul Junction on the Gloucester & Sharpness Canal." The decision follows Stroud District Council's investment of £3million in the project, and Gloucestershire County Council's recent announcement that it will commit £700,000.

If the bid to the Heritage Lottery Fund is successful, 'Stroudwater with the Canal & River Trust's Aelred Derbyshire contribution of £125k per annum (plus staff time as can be made available) continuing over five years.

## **April Meeting** "Eling Tide Mill, the Past and the Future" with Ruth Kerr

The meeting was reasonably well attended, 28 in total, including three new faces which had seen the meeting advertised in the Newsletter.

The society welcomed Ruth Kerr, a Community Engagement Officer for the Eling Tide Mile. Ruth explained the long history of the site, located on the causeway which impounds the tidal Bartley Water, and the Grade II listed building. The incoming tide floods through a group of hatches in the causeway to fill the mill pond behind the causeway. After high water, when the hatches have been closed and the level of the



tide has fallen sufficiently on the seaward side of the causeway, the sluice gates are opened to drive the water wheel and in turn the mill machinery.

The history of the causeway possibly dates back to the time of the Romans (c400 AD) but the earliest surviving reference to mill is in the Domesday Book in 1086 AD. Research has identified the mill was owned by King John in the 1200's and later by William of Wykeham, the Bishop of Winchester, in 1382 AD. Subsequently ownership was transferred to Winchester College until 1975 when the building was bought the New Forest District Council. The lease for the mill on Christmas day December 1418 included the requirement to rebuild the mill, house and causeway. The current mill was dates from 1785 and was built by John Chandler the lease holder at that time.

Grain was unloaded directly in to the mill from vessels moored in the harbour and the quay was developed further to include ship and boat building and shipment of timber, coal and food. 1847 saw the arrival of the railway in Totton with a spur constructed to the wharf in 1851, the rails of which are still visible at the end of the quay. In this period, the separate steam mill was constructed on the quay. By the 1930's the tide mill was being used as a provender (animal feed) mill until 1941 when war restrictions stopped operations.

The collection of causeway tolls have always been associated with the mill and the toll gate has long been a recognisable local landmark. Weight restrictions on the causeway previously required the bus service to unload the passengers on one side of the causeway, cross on foot while the bus was driven to the other side, before re-joining the bus.

The local council group has recently secured a grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund to develop the site and the adjacent heritage centre. The work will include conservation of the mill and improvements to visibility of the mill machinery, in addition to new features in the heritage centre to explain water power.

After knocking the dust off Purton, we left our mooring and headed down though Stockton and Bascote locks on the Grand Union Canal mooring up below Cape Locks and Hatton flight. Up bright and eager we teamed up with another boat to go up the steep Hatton Flight, a tea break at the top then motored on alone through Kingswood Junction and Knowle Locks.

Here we were informed there was very low water in the cut above the locks. The suggestion was we turn and go back to the Stratford Canal and go through the Lapworth flight. Not to be defeated we carried on very slowly, going out of gear through the bridge holes and moored up at 9pm.

On day thee, we pressed on to Camp Hill and Garrison Locks on the Birmingham & Warwick and a short section of the Junction Canal before going under the wonderful construction and labyrinth of "Spaghetti Junction". We found it an interesting day of old canal heritage, foundries, and machine shops, loading bays, huge waste disposal and paper recycling sites but then "Star City" a massive gambling and entertainment complex, built on the site of Nechells power station. We did not stop as I had not brought my "fancy clothes" but moored at the bottom of Perry Barr Locks.

We set off early the next morning to find there was no water in the intermediate pounds. This meant water had to be brought down from the top locks - no problem - just time consuming. Moving on up

to Rushall Junction and locks, we arrived at Brownhills mid-afternoon to find excellent moorings for 30 plus boats.
