October Meeting

'So you think you know about Industrial Archaeology?' with John Silman and Tony Yoward

The large audience at our October meeting were treated to a feast of intriguing industrial archaeological questions when John and Tony showed us over sixty slides covering a very wide of subjects.

It is obviously impractical to list them all here, but the following will, hopefully, give a little of the flavour of the evening.

- Beam Engines, Bristol Trams, Caledonian Railway, and the Hay Tor Granite Railway.
- From the milling industry we had views of an overshot water mill and a hand operated quoin, a French paper mill, a water driven snuff mill.
- Views of the waterways were very much in evidence – Telford's Pontcysyllte Aqueduct, Bingley Five-Rise, Warehouse spanning the canal basin in Sheffield, a demolished aqueduct on the Leominster Canal, a train of Tom Puddings, the Lion Salt Works adjacent to the Trent & Mersey Canal.
- Bridges were not left out – Brunel's suspension bridge at Clifton, Telford's bridge over the River Wye, the Toll Cottage at the end of another of Telford's bridges at Tewkesbury, an early 1700s bridge at Pontypridd.
- Back to the water – we saw an East Coast Shrimper, seemingly 'lost' at the entrance to the Solent, shops loading china clay at Charlestown (with two tall ships in shot), 'Stackies' – Thames Barges loaded with hay.

- Our own locality was certainly not neglected. We had a 1924 shot of Ryde Pier with a motor cycle and sidecar disembarking from the 'hinged' wooden ferry, Bosham Signal Box and Level Crossing, Eastney Pumping Station in Portsmouth, Lime Kilns at Twyford Waterworks, Sewer Gas Eliminator in Winchester.
- The military wasn't left out either – there was the restored Semaphore Signal Tower at Chatley Heath and the Military Depot at Weedon, which had its own arm off the Grand Union Canal.
- Some macabre scenes – a coffin lift at the catacombs in London and an interesting tomb stone at Warnford.
- And some 'odd' ones – a Prison Treadmill (used for corn grinding), and a Victorian cast iron public lavatory.

Oh, there were so many more I wish I could mention them all.

The evening finished with John and Tony trying to tax our brains (and memories) attempting to identify a number of artefacts.

Many thanks to John and Tony for a very interesting evening, laced with plenty of humour.

On 14th September, the Secretary of State for Environment Food and Rural Affairs announced that the Leicestershire County Council (Ashby de la Zouch Canal Extension) Order would be made under section 3 of the Transport and Works Act 1992. The new and reinstated canal is to run for about 4.5 kilometres to Measham, where it will terminate at a new wharf.



SCS member spotted in Sweden

I attended the World Canal Conference in Sweden in August, together with Roger Squires and Hugh Potter and several other UK delegates. I visited the WCC web site (<http://www5.auderis.se/wcc2005>) yesterday and was amazed to find the attached photos. The first is yours truly sporting his Southampton Canal Society attire (and AWCC cap). The lady in the picture was from the USA (sorry forgotten the name as usual), but we are all participating in a traditional Swedish pastime that featured regularly on a very hectic schedule of visits.

We visited all six of Sweden's canals and the second picture shows the staircase locks on the Kinda Canal at Linköping. They keep the flight empty, with gates open and fill from the top, as shown. The day before, we had visited the famous Gota Canal, which is a world heritage site. The canal crosses Lake Vattern, where we were due a boat trip and where we found out at first hand how choppy a large space of inland water can get – most of us were rather ill and not one glass or bottle remained intact!

Not a place for narrowboats you may think, but four British NBs did make it to Trollhättan, the conference centre, where they created great interest. They may have gone over by Ro-Ro, but they did manage to progress from Gothenburg, through the Trollhättan Canal to the Dalaslands Canal and on to a Norwegian lake, which is reckoned to be a first. The party was led by Paul Ayres with his working pair [Aldgate and Angel—see below], plus Brian and Margaret Oliver on Zavala (St Pancras members) and Clive and Jill Field on Witcombe (third picture).

The visited ended with a splendid evening entry to Stockholm on an historic steamer, a cruise around the archipelago the following day and, unplanned for us, the icing on the cake – the launch of a new tall ship by Princess Victoria in a harbour that was so chaotically full of boats of all sizes. A wonderful trip all round.
