IWA ANNOUNCES NATIONAL CONFERENCE FOR WATERWAY SOCIETIES

The IWA is to host a national conference for waterway societies on Saturday November 30th 1996. Eminent speakers will be looking at subjects of major concern to all waterway societies and trusts who are engaged either in the restoration of derelict waterways or are concerned about the care, conservation and use of navigable waterways.

The conference will be held at the prestigious Sandwell Council House in the West Midlands and whilst aimed at waterway societies and trusts, delegates will be welcomed from all spheres of the waterways world. IWA National Chairman, Audrey Smith said "There are so many important challenges facing the inland waterways at present, it is vital that we bring together waterway groups from across the country to address issues that will affect us all for many years to come. The recent report from IWAAC, the Department of Environment's Review of Navigation, the disastrous highway blockages being placed on the Derby and Thames and Severn Canals and the increasing extremism of some wildlife lobbyists are all matters that should be on everyone's agenda and

will be addressed at this conference."

Robin Higgs, Chairman of Southern Canals Association and of IWA's Restoration Committee said "This conference will be one of IWA's most important events in our Jubilee year. It is a key part of IWA's strategy to work closely with trusts and societies in bringing about the most favourable climate for waterway restoration and the maintenance of existing navigations to the highest standards. We aim to bring together waterway societies from all over the country to present a truly national picture and to provide inspiration to reinvigorate the waterway movement."

There will be a sponsored walk along the Basingstoke Canal between Woking and Ash Vale on Sunday 6 October. This is being organised jointly by the Surrey & Hampshire Canal Society and IWA Guildford & Reading Branch to raise funds towards a backpumping scheme at Woodham Locks. Whilst the canal has been restored, water shortages have forced 28 of the canal's 29 locks to be closed for prolonged periods during summer months to conserve supplies.

Far and Wide

August's meeting is traditionally poorly attended as the holiday season gets into full swing. This year's member's slides meeting saw more people than last year and many more slides from far and wide. Indeed, not all the slides could be fitted into the time available.

Chris Beahan kicked off the meeting with a good series of pictures taken on his holiday on the Stourport ring only the previous week.

These were followed by slides taken in 1975 in Italy. Presented by Charles Lewis, we saw, amongst other things, the Leaning Tower of Pisa, the Coliseum in Rome and the canals of Venice.

The first half was rounded off by Paul Herbert's pictures of Foxton in the early 1970's "before we got interested in canals". He followed these with shots of the Basingstoke Canal in the mid 70's including a couple of attractive snow scenes.

After the break the next slides were presented by Eric Mayhew, taking us north of the border to the Caledonian and Crinan Canals - waterways which often get forgotten.

A wide variety of places from yesteryear were shown by David Townley-Jones. Starting with his service on Cunard's *Carmania*, we saw the West Indies and the Panama Canal. These were followed by shots afloat in Holland and on the Thames. He rounded off with Sir Alec Rose's return to Southsea from his round the world trip.

The Chairman wasn't even in the country, but we couldn't get away from some of his slides (only kidding, Brian). These featured our Jubilee Event on the Romsey Canal and the recent trip to the Braunston Boat Show.

Added to all these slides was five minutes video of the assembly of the Jubilee Jigsaw in Birmingham in June shot by Frank Stokes.

Thanks to all those who brought slides along and also to Sue Lewis for her valiant efforts with the slide projector. A most entertaining evening. Come to next year's meeting and see the world!

Southampton Boat Show
