MILITARY COUP IN WILTSHIRE. Waterway Recovery Group (who are celebrating their Silver Jubilee this year) will be holding one of their (in)famous Big Digs (this time called 'Dig 95'). The date is set for 5th/6th November 1995, and the venue is the Thames & Severn Canal at the site of the intended Latton by-pass where a navigable culvert has yet to be agreed by the road builders. This will be WRG's first full scale Big Dig since over 1000 volunteers turned up to dramatically clear 3 miles of the Wilts & Berks Canal near Wantage in 1991. For this occasion, the close co-operation of the military has been agreed, involving tank movements in the area.

KENNET & AVON CANAL. It is planned for there to be a working boat rally at Newbury at the end of July The museum at the wharf is putting on a special display and there should be a funfare in the park opposite the wharf. More details when they become available.




YOU ARE INVITED to join IWA Solent & Arun Branch on a visit to Coultershaw Beam Pump near Petworth, West Sussex on Sunday 16th July at 10.30am. (see map for location)

The waterwheel-driven, three-throw beam pump was installed in 1782 to pump water from the River Rother to Petworth, 1.5 miles away and 150ft higher.

In addition to the unique 18th century Beam Pump the building also contains a variety of smaller water pumps, many in working order. The upper floor has displays on the history of pumping, the Rother Navigation to Midhurst and the history of the Coultershaw locality. A visit to the Beam Pump can include a canal stable and warehouse building plus a derelict lock chamber of the Rother Navigation.
