## November Meeting

### “South Coast Circular Cruise” on board nb ‘Ocean Princess’ with James Griffin

A large audience welcomed James Griffin, Managing Director of The Wyvern Shipping Co Ltd, operators of a large quality hire boat fleet based at Leighton Buzzard on the Grand Union Canal, to our November meeting. Wyvern Shipping was founded in 1953 as a carrying company, subsequently becoming a hire boat company, which was purchased by James’ parents in 1960.

The subject of James’ talk was the ‘South Coast Circular Cruise’ of Wyvern’s ‘Ocean Princess’. Unlike some other sea-going narrow boats, which have been adapted for such cruising, ‘Ocean Princess’ was purposely designed and built for the purpose and James ran through the design and build requirements of such a craft. This narrow boat was built by Wyvern Shipping in 1999 for both inshore and offshore cruising and is fitted out as a luxury 6 berth craft. Special features include a 75 bhp Beta Marine Kubota diesel engine with a cruising speed of 6 knots, bow thruster, dual steering fore and aft, satellite navigation, echo sounder, radar reflector, mast with anchor and steaming light, port and starboard navigation lights and anchors fore and aft,

plus many other items of necessary safety equipment, including automatic inflating life raft.

As James explained, the purpose of the trip was to publicize and promote the building of the Bedford & Milton Keynes Waterway. The crew of ‘Ocean Princess’ consisted of James, his sons, Philip and Robert, and John Chapman, the ship’s navigator.

After initial sea trials in the Wash, James and his crew took ‘Ocean Princess’ down the Grand Union Canal to Brentford where they joined the Thames, on through the centre of London and the Thames Barrier to the estuary and into the English Channel. This first stage of the cruise took them to Newhaven and, with the aid of excellent slides, James described the changing weather and sea conditions, including 4-5 foot waves in the Dover Straits. The second stage took ‘Ocean Princess’ from Newhaven to Falmouth and the third from there to the Isles of Scilly and finally back to her home base via the Bristol Channel, stopping off on the Bude Canal on route, and then Bristol Docks and

## SOCIETY OUTING TO WHITCHURCH SILK MILL AND LONGBRIDGE MILL

There will be an outing to the above mills on Saturday 22nd April 2006.

Whitchurch Silk Mill was built initially as a woollen mill in 1800 and silk has been woven there since the 1820/1830s. It is

now a working museum which now produces high quality silks to order for theatrical costume, interior designers and historic houses. There will be a guided tour of

the mill and we will meet there at 10.30am.

There has been a mill sited at Longbridge for many years. It was badly damaged by fire in 1991 and restoration by the Chiltern partnership of millwrights was completed in 1997. The Mill is now a Brewers Fayre restaurant but the mill is working and milling takes place once a month. John Silman will give us a conducted tour to explain the process of milling and the unusual machinery employed in this historical

method of food production. We intend to arrive at the Mill at about 1.15pm where we will have lunch (extra charge) and then have our tour of the mill.

Wholemeal flour may be purchased in the pub at a cost of £1.50 for 2kg.

The cost will be £6 to include tours of both mills. This cost includes a donation to the Hampshire Mills Group whose members have kindly agreed to work the Mill on a day when it is not usually working.

the Kennet & Avon Canal etc.

James described many of the trials and tribulations en route, including several visits from 'officialdom' including Officers of the Maritime and Coastguard Agency. Altogether, 'Ocean Princess' covered 650 nautical miles at sea (in addition to her inland voyages), with overnight stops at Queenborough, Newhaven, Yarmouth (Isle of Wight), Mevagissey, Falmouth, Hugh Town (Isles of Scilly), Port Quin Bay (at anchor), Bude and Portishead (at anchor), before entering the sea lock at Bristol docks.

After completing his description of the 'South Coast Circular Cruise' James went on to briefly describe the successful follow-up 'Five Kingdoms Cruise' which took 'Ocean Princess' from Leighton Buzzard to Scotland, maybe the subject of a future talk to the Society.

As usual, we can project prints (up to 7" x 5") onto the screen as well as transparencies and digital pictures. So if you don't take slides or digital pictures, you too will be able to show something of waterways interest as well.

Again, like the last few years, the evening will also incorporate a photographic competition. To be held just before the tea interval, this competition is open to all members - you don't have to be showing other pictures during the evening. What we're looking for is **one** picture which can be anything to do (even loosely) with the waterways. The competition will be judged by all those present at the meeting. And as an incentive to enter, there will be a mystery prize given to the winner.
