# Drama as cows are pulled from canal



Teamwork between fire crew, farmers, a vet and staff at Napton Narrowboats Marina saved the lives of two cows on Christmas Day.

Several cattle had strayed from a nearby farm overnight and two - one of which was pregnant - had fallen into the Oxford Canal.

Four fire engines and a rescue boat were called to the scene shortly before 10am.

Marina staff worked quickly to move boats to allow the firefighters to gain access to the canal, and local farmers helped with the rescue.

The cows were removed from the water just after 11am and a vet from the neighbourhood sedated one of the animals which had a considerable amount of water in its lungs. Both animals are now said to have recovered from their ordeal.

Onlooker Patrick Bradley, who sent us this image, said: "This is another example of the dedication of the unsung heroes of the emergency services who are on call all day, every day, when everyone else is enjoying themselves."





Rounding Selsey Bill through the Looe Channel from our base in Chichester can only be safely accomplished in daylight and fair weather so we are dependent on the forecast. Accordingly the programme may be subject to delay or cancellation at short notice.



Our destination is the Swan Bridge at Pulborough where a slip enables us to land by dinghy. Here an ancient wadeway blocks the river and prevents us proceeding further.

'Pies'

Local HW (Littlehampton +4) is the best time to start downstream and though the ebb will carry us over the shallows a stop is required to wait for clearance under Houghton Bridge.

Upstream or down the passage lasts about four hours including time spent at anchor on the way.

Trains between Pulborough and Littlehampton (hourly on Sundays and two


The wooden motor boat Hood, then recently restored, at the Braunston Working Boat Rally in June 2005. Hood shows the excellent, decorative paintwork that both the Samuel Barlow and S E Barlow companies were renowned for.

The firm of S E Barlow was formed in 1919. It was started by Samuel Edwin Barlow, a grandson of Samuel Barlow.

Hood entered service in 1943 having been built by S E Barlow at Anchor Dock, Glascote.

At its largest the fleet was about 70 boats delivering coal on contract to dairies, paper mills, power stations, factories and coal merchants. Up until 1946 the company thrived in fierce competition for the coal trade. In 1957 the company was sold to Samuel Barlow Coal Carrying Co. Ltd.

# "Look! Real working narrowboats!

# Look! You can even crew them! How good is that!"

Exclaimed Dave shortly before joining the Narrow Boat Trust in 2003

For those seeking a more authentic experience of the waterways of England, then discovering its heritage aboard a pair of vintage working boats is an excellent way to do it.

After Dave joined the Trust and after many memorable hours at the tiller is now a trusted Captain who, with crew members, is responsible for delivering essential heating fuel to inaccessible islands on the Thames.

Established in 1970, the Trust strives to uphold the time-honed methods and

experience of carrying cargo on the 1930's 'Town Class' pair Nuneaton & Brighton, This trading on the waterways also raises income for this registered charity by carrying cargoes like coal from the Midlands down to the Thames. The butty Brighton with it's detachable stairway allows the general public access at waterway events to our authentic boatman's cabins that also serves as cosy accommodation for crew. But the NBT is no preservation society with floating museum pieces, but a charity that earns a honest income from canal carrying by using the boats as they were intended.

The membership consists of all ages and gender and there are a number of experienced couples, some accompanied with their children who enjoy crewing as a family, along with a growing number of younger enthusiastic individuals from all walks of life, eager to crew and work on the boats whatever the weather! Some are excommercial boatmen who pass on their many hard-won techniques to new members who all receive a comprehensive boat 'familiarisation' and health & safety instruction before first casting off. This 'familiarisation' can be a lot more convivial during the winter weekend work parties for hands-on restoration and maintenance on the working pair.

With nearly forty years of campaigning with all the other principle waterway organisations to keep the canals viable, the Trust sustains the pressure - especially to demonstrate using it for carrying cargoes.


Opportunities to crew the boats are many as they are frequently moved from one place to another carrying cargo or to be welcomed at waterway rallies and events countrywide and this allows boating skills to be learnt quickly if one has ambitions to become a captain like Dave.

The experience of crewing the pair of boats, smoothly and efficiently through the waterway system is incomparable to any other canal experience and one that gives a profound appreciation of what the canals were originally built for.
