<u>CANAL CLOSES ROAD.</u> Traffic on the A1137 road through the centre of Boston was diverted for ten days last November while BW replaced the two sea gates at the end of the Witham Navigation.

Weighing 15 tonnes each and measuring 20x26ft, the gates are amongst the largest ever made at the Stanley Ferry Workshop. They are made of ekki, one of the tropical hardwoods from managed forests, which is replacing oak as a material for lock gates.

BOOK COLLECTORS. Waterway Recovery Group has been left a large collection of waterways books. The books will be sold by postal auction and all proceeds will go to WRG Canal Camps. Reserve prices have been set at absolute minimum by Mark Baldwin, specialised book dealer. <u>SEVERN BORE</u>. The prediction list for the Severn Bore in 1995 is disappointing. It is not anticipated that a 'large' bore will occur this year. Predictions of 'fairly large' bores, during daylight hours, are made for the 1st and 2nd February, 3rd and 19th March, 17th April and 24th November. All other 'fairly large' bores are during the hours of darkness. Timings of these bores are available from Newsletter Editor.

## JUBILEES

IWA GOLDEN JUBILEE. Celebrations begin with the 1995 National Festival at Chester in August and continue for 16 months until the end of 1996. During that time there will be many special functions with the accent on recruiting and fund raising.

In Issue 2 of the IWA Jubilee Journal there are already 33 events planned on specific dates and 16 further events planned but with the dates to be announced.

WATERWAY RECOVERY GROUP celebrates its twenty fifth anniversary this year - 1995. A paragraph in the Comment column of the WRG magazine 'Navvies' No 148, January/February 1995 states - "WRG is known only to a tiny percentage of the general public, and although most waterways users have heard of us, many don't really know what we do or who we are."

If any SCS members wants to know more about Canal restoration, the minimum subscription to 'Navvies' is only £1.50 - and that is for 6 issues! (Doesn't even pay for the postage.)

#### NEW CANALS?

1) A campaign to create a new link from the River Ouse at Bedford to the Grand Union Canal is being spearheaded by Brian Young, an active member of the Cambridge Branch of the Inland Waterways Association. This new route would offer possibilities of easy access between the river systems of the Fens and East Anglia and the main canal network. There have been two previous attempts at building this navigation; the first in 1810 with a group involved in a joint venture with the Grand Junction Canal Company, that failed in 1813, and a second proposal in the early 1890s that reached the House of Lords but failed in 1894.

Approved plans for the new Marston Vale Community Forest, under the auspicies of English Heritage, propose to develop the area between Bedford and the M1 motorway into a range of water recreation and nature conservation facilities. Brian Young believes that a canal could be included in the plans and is gathering support for the creation of a Bedford-Grand Union Navigation Trust to promote the scheme.

Estimates for the project are thought to be in the range £17-25 million, but the first step is a detailed technical feasability study at approximately £50,000. Possible sources of funding include the Millennium Commission, for which stage 1 of the application must be lodged by the end of February.

British 'Waterways' proposals for water transfer via the canal system included increasing the water supply into the River Ouse. Supporters of the new link argue that the transfer of water from the Grand Union through the controlled environment of a canal would be preferable and, if that was the case, some funds might be available via that project.

2) Basingstoke Canal. The Surrey and Hants Canal Society has been working on the restoration of the canal from the west end of Greywell Tunnel towards Penny Bridge outside Basingstoke. Beyond Penny Bridge, developments such as the M3 and A30, as well as the building of the town's bus station on the original terminal basin, made further progress seem most unlikely. The borough council is now adopting a scheme for restoration of the canal from the town centre 1.75 miles to Old Basing House. This is expected to cost about £4.8 million over the next five years; it appeals to the council as a means of providing a central focus to the town which is lacking one at present.

The canal society has expressed amazement and excitement at this proposal to restore part of the length of canal which they had thought 'lost' and is naturally enthusiastically supporting it and the next stage of the proposals which would link up to their present restoration site. This would leave the question of navigating round or through Graywell Hill to be solved before the Basingstoke Canal becomes a complete entity once more.
