NEW BOOKS.

1. "Exploring the Grand Western Canal in Somerset" by Jean Hall & Joy Yeates. Following a brief introduction to the canal, its history and engineering features, this 23 page booklet describes a walk along the route between Lowdwells and Taunton. Short detours from the canal line to nearby places of interest are included, as are attractive line drawings. The second part of the book is in the form of eight short (half day) walks, each based on the canal. Simple sketch maps are provided, but they are probably best used with Ordnance Survey maps.

2. "Between Two Rivers" by Gordon Moore & Chrissie Franklin.

Even if you live outside the HTV area, this attractive booklet 'inspired by the popular HTV programmes' is an excellent read. It recounts the history of the Stroudwater and Thames & Severn Canals and divides the route between Framilode and Inglesham into five sections. Each has a clear map, features to look out for and lists of refreshment places. Included are excellent photos, some of historic scenes and a full page on the Cotswold Canals Trust.

BASINGSTOKE CANAL. The Surrey & Hants Canal Society made good their eighteen year old promise to dredge 10 miles of the Basingstoke Canal on Saturday, April 17th, when the society's steam dredger 'Perseverance' reached Pondtail Bridge, Fleet.

The society bought 'Perseverance' in a condemned state 20 years ago for £225. A team of enthusiasts stripped and renovated the vessel before it could be moved to Odiham, where a length of canal had to be excavated to allow it to be launched.

Volunteer crews have operated 'Perseverance' through fine weather and foul, beaten only by extreme conditions. It has been stuck fast more than once in winter by ice up to 4" thick. The mud barges were aground for six months in 1990 during a prolonged drought. In October 1987 the dredger was hemmed in by fallen trees after the infamous hurricane during which a 60ft oak tree crashed across the boiler housing, but fortunately did little damage.

'Perseverance' has won the maritime section of the 1993 Steam Heritage Awards and the Society now plans to dry dock the dredger before deciding on its future. As the only known vessel of its type still in workindg order, at least one waterways museum has offered the vessel a 'permanent' home - but with a constant need for maintenance dredging on the canal, the dredger may not go into retirement yet.
