IWA JUBILEE PHOTOGRAPHIC COMPETITION. This competition is growing into a large event. The initial sponsors, Canon UK Ltd have been joined by Agfa Gavaert Limited and Blakes Holidays with Crown blue Line, France. The range of prizes offered has also grown to a most tempting array.
