TOURISM AWARD. The Kennet and Avon Canal is the winner of the 1991 Tourism for Tomorrow UK Award, which was announced at the end of January. The award is sponsored jointly by the 'Wish You Were Here' television holiday programme, British Tourist Authority and the Tour Operators' Study Group as a recognition of holiday destinations which are concerned for the environment and have done something about it.

As the UK winner, the canal joined the winners of the Continental Europe and the Rest of the World categories for the overall winner of the trophy. The overall winner was the Rest of the World category which was a project in Nepal. FUN RUN FOR EUROPE. - Chichester Canal Society. Sunday 5th April 1992. Last year the Mayor of Chichester nominated The Chichester Canal Society as one of his two official charities. As a result over £2,500 was raised from a series of events towards the cost of buying a tripboat for use on the Canal. This has now been purchased and will be in operation in the Summer for the benefit of not only able-bodied people but also the elderly and disabled.

In 1992 the Chichester Canal Society are supporting the Chichester in Europe celebrations and are providing an event in which Fun Runners and Walkers of all ages can participate. The main course which is 8 miles (13 km) long follows the line of the Canal to the Harbour skirting the water before returning across open farmland to Donnington and then back to the Canal Basin where the Run/Walk finishes.

In response to several requests we have also organised a shorter course of about 3.5 miles (5.6 km) for unaccompanied runners under 13 years.

All proceeds from entry fees and sponsorship will be used to equip the tripboat.

GLOUCESTER EVENTS. 1992 is a double anniversary for waterways in the South West. 200 years of the Gloucester & Sharpness Canal and 150 years of the River Severn Navigation. To celebrate these events an open weekend will be held at Gloucester Docks over the May Day weekend, 2nd-4th May, and a Gloucester Gathering will be held on 4th-5th July.

During the May Day weekend British Waterways will be showing visitors some of the skills, craft and plant used to maintain the local waterways. The National Waterways Museum will also be presenting craft displays.

The theme of the July gathering is the traditional mix of sea going, river and canal craft at Gloucester. To attract boats of all types, British Waterways is offering a free seven day licence and moorings in Gloucester Docks for five days to any craft booked into the event.
