August Meeting

Society's 41st Annual General Meeting

Twenty four members attended the Society's 41st Annual General Meeting held at Chilworth Parish Hall on 31 July 2008, which was chaired by our Chairman, Paul Herbert, whilst our President, Brian Evans, officiated for the election of officers and committee. The meeting followed the usual procedure and all documentation had been published in the August Newsletter.

The Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer & Membership Secretary presented their reports, including the 2007/08 year-end accounts, highlighting issues of particular note. Paul was pleased to advise members that, contrary to the comment in his report, Anne Coleman was able to continue as Treasurer & Membership Secretary, and Maureen Greenham had volunteered to be Assistant Treasurer & Membership Secretary.

In general, the Society continued to be successful and its finances were in a healthy position. We had enjoyed an excellent programme of speakers and other monthly events, including a number of outings and another entertaining Skittles Evening.

Many members had taken the opportunity to purchase the new range of 40th anniversary clothing. We had welcomed a number of new members but it still remained our top priority to increase membership. A number of new marketing initiatives were discussed.

Both in his report and at the AGM Paul thanked all those Society members who contributed to the Society's success.

Anne Coleman advised of an amendment to her report which had stated that the income and expenditure year-end account showed a profit of £178.67. However this had had to be adjusted and the actual profit was now £105.67. Anne also referred to proposed changes to the Society's accountancy system in order to simplify the accounts.

Regarding membership subscriptions, because of the Society's current financial position, the Committee had recommended that there be no increase for 2008/09 and further that, in future, the membership year be brought into line with our financial year, viz. 1 April to 31 March. Members agreed with both those recommendations.

There then followed the election of Officers and Committee. All the current Officers and Committee members were re-elected. In addition, Alan Rose had indicated his willingness to stand for Vice-Chairman and was duly elected. Maureen Greenham was elected Assistant Treasurer & Membership Secretary. Laura Sturrock had volunteered to become the Society's Auditor at last year's AGM and she was still willing to fulfil that role, and her offer was gratefully accepted by the AGM.

Peter Oates had indicated that he was willing to continue as the Society's Webmaster and Editor of the Newsletter.

There were two items of Any Other Business, both from Robb Unsworth asking if the Committee could consider a sound system for use by our speakers; and at our monthly meetings, after general introductions, could the Chairman invite members to raise any canal related matters. Both these ideas were adopted and, regarding the proposed sound system, possible alternatives would be examined.

Robb Unsworth also wished to take the opportunity to "thank all the Committee for the super job done by all".

Following the AGM members enjoyed a colourful and seasonal DVD covering the Great Ouse and Cam river systems. Copies are available from Video Active. (Many thanks to Peter, Laura, Gill and Paul for providing their IT equipment to enable the DVD to be shown).

Narrowboat Dreams?

Members who attended Steve Haywood's talk to the Society in April this year will remember him mentioning that he had another book in preparation. I am pleased to advise that "*Narrowboat Dreams: A Journey North by England's Waterways*" has now been published.

"Steve Haywood has a problem. He doesn't know where he comes from. In the south people think he's a northerner; in the north, they think he's from the south. Judged against global warming and the sad demise of "*Celebrity Big Brother*", this hardly registers highly on the Richter scale of world disasters. But it's enough to worry Steve. And it's enough of an excuse for him to escape the routine of his life in London for a voyage of discovery along England's inland waterways.

Travelling by traditional narrowboat, he heads north from Banbury in deepest Oxfordshire, through the former industrial wastelands of

the now vibrantly modern Manchester, to the trendy affluence of Hebden Bridge at the centre of West Yorkshire's ciabatta belt. With irrepressible humour he describes the history of the canals, his encounters with characters along the way, and the magic that makes England's waterways so appealing".

As Steve describes himself – "*At home, I'm a cantankerous old git. On the boat, after a week's cruising, I'm just a cantankerous old git with dirty hair!*"

Itchen Navigation

The £2,400,000 scheme to preserve the Itchen Navigation between Winchester and Southampton in Hampshire was formally launched on 25th July. The five-year project, for which major works are due to begin in September is to repair river banks and the towpath along the waterway, and will provide a recreational amenity in the area, conserve and encourage wildlife (particularly water voles, otters and damselflies) and raise awareness of the Navigation and its historical importance to the area. The work is supported by a consortium of organisations including IWA's Solent & Arun

Branch and Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust.

Work is to take place on several different stretches of the 10-mile waterway, at Winchester, Southampton, Eastleigh and Bishopstoke. The first major works to start are £80,000 worth of improvements to river banks between Wharf Bridge and Tun Bridge in Winchester. Since October 2007, the Wildlife Trust has commissioned a series of wildlife surveys.

Day-Star Theatre are returning to Chilworth again by popular request.


