AUGUST MEETING. Members Night. Another entertaining evening of variety. First, Martin Cripps presented a short video excerpt from a TV programme featuring a Canadian canoeist on a journey from Oxford to Birmingham. Martin then followed up with his own slides of the Museum of the North-West at Ellesmere Port and the Leeds & Liverpool Canal at Bingley.

Murray Blowfield showed slides - various from Exeter to Eling, and of the Rivers Moselle and Rhine. All featured water and often boats. Many were of local scenes which encourage us to go and have a lock for ourselves.

Frank Stubbs rounded off the evening with his record of the recent IWA visit to Ireland. It was interesting to hear how much enthusiasm the Irish Government has for canal restoration.

FRENCH NAVIGABLE WATERWAYS continue to attract British boats, and understandably so. One of the safest and simplest ways of getting, say, a narrowboat to France is to put it on a lorry and put the lorry on a cross-Channel ferry. This was seen a few years ago when some ex-Anglo Welsh boats were off to start a new life as hire boats on a French Canal. There is now a new way for lorries to cross the Channel by going beneath it, so which will be the first narrowboat to pass through the Channel Tunnel? We await the answer with photographic evidence if available, unless it's already been done!

ARUN CRUISE. Sunday 22nd May, 29 boats and 61 crew members set off from the Waters Edge Inn at Pulbcrough, West Sussex and cruised the 3½ miles to the limit of navigation at Pallingham Quay - and back.

Our members Peter Glover and Jim Lanigan were there to represent us (see Newsletter No 278 - July 1994) and thanks to them for taking part.

Thanks also to members who sponsored their efforts. £47.00 was raised by sponsorship and the Society will be topping up the sum to a round £50.00.

IWA/WRG CHARITY BANK. The Society has learnt that since August 1988 over £10,000 has been raised.

This is a permanent request which will continue indefinitely. There are now over 130 waterway restoration schemes underway in the British Isles and the money raised goes to support these.

KENNET & AVON WALK. The second National Waterway Walk along the K & A Canal was formally opened on 9th July. Members of the Ramblers Association then walked the 73 mile towpath in stages from Bath to Reading. Creation of the walk has been a joint effort by BW, local authorities and the Kennet & Avon Canal Trust, led by project officer Martin Brown.

After just 15 months of fundraising by the Trust, the first part of works to solve the canal's water supply problems is underway. A pumping station is being built at the foot of the Devizes flight to resupply the top of the flight.

WIN THE CHAIR. This year's 200th anniversary of the Basingstoke Canal is being celebrated by the Boats for the Handicapped Association with a grand draw. Based on the Basingstoke, the charity has commissioned a unique prize in the form of a hand-carved chair, with seat and back depicting the designs found on the Pinkerton Shilling. The original shillings were issued by the canal's builder to his workers in lieu of payment in coin of the realm. The Basingstoke token depicted on one side a sailing barge and on the other a barrow and navvies' tools. Other draw prizes of a wooden stool and a loving spoon are also hand-carved. There will be lifts at bow and stern, special gangplanks and hoists for use in the bathroom and at the side of some berths.
